It gives me great pleasure to advise, that on Saturday the 26th of October I met with The Honourable Peter Malinauskas MP Premier of South Australia for the announcement of the successful implementation of the Neighbourhood Watch safety and security campaign for Marino Railway Station.

The South Australian Government has announced it will invest **2 million Dollars to upgrade the Marino Railway Station**. The work will include CCTV cameras, an emergency phone, a new fit for purpose all weather shelter and platform modifications.

Work will commence in the first half of 2025.

# Sarah Luscombe, Coastal Ward Councillor, City of Marion Scholefield Road Intersection

A Safety Risk in our Community

Local residents would be aware of the safety risk that is posed by the Scholefield Road/Ocean Boulevard intersection, and Neighbourhood Watch is advocating for a traffic solution.

Scholefield Road is a key arterial road connection point for residents in Marino, Seacliff, and north-western Hallett Cove, with approximately 6700 cars per day. There are ongoing difficulties using this intersection in a safe and convenient manner, with 8 crashes (including, sadly, 3 casualties) between 2018 and 2022.



To add to the concerns, the new Seacliff Village development on Scholefield Road will significantly increase traffic. I am informed that there will be over 2000 new residents; a new shopping facility with 18 tenancies (including a major shopping center); and a health center with an ambulance station. This is all within the timeframe of 2 years. The new Marino Hall, a fantastic hub for our community, is also due to open in February 2025. To add to this, a new clubhouse and pro shop is being built at the revitalised Seacliff Golf Course, which will all naturally draw more traffic to this area as a destination to utilise these great facilities.

It is important for residents to take action and advocate to our MPs for a timely traffic solution at the intersection.

Without intervention, the existing traffic problems on Scholefield Road will continue to magnify. The Seacliff Village developer will pay for an extended right hand turn lane from Ocean Boulevard into Scholefield Road, which is a good start. However, a traffic study shows that traffic signals at the intersection are also required. The extended

right hand turn lane into Scholefield on its own will make it even more difficult and dangerous to turn right from Scholefield up the hill onto Ocean Boulevard. Residents are already rat running through other local streets to avoid this intersection, creating safety issues elsewhere like around Seacliff Primary School.

Whilst traffic signals are required, unfortunately, the state government, who are responsible for Ocean Boulevard, have not provided a timeframe to build the traffic signals.

Without a solution, there are more accidents waiting to happen.

So, what can we do?

I have already successfully moved a motion for Marion Council to write to the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport to advocate for the installation of traffic signals at this intersection, and I am grateful for Neighbourhood Watch's support. Your voice as a local resident is also pivotal – it is the job of elected officials to listen to our community. I encourage everyone who uses this intersection, or lives in the local streets around the area to write to your MPs to advocate for a timely traffic solution and ensure the safety of this intersection.

## **Community Neighbourhood Watch Crime Prevention Signs.**Darren BAILHACHE - Area Coordinator

The neighbourhood Watch Committee are constantly revising the placement of your Neighbourhood Watch community crime prevention signs, based upon anti-social behaviour reported to Police within our community.

Statistics have identified that an area with an active Neighbourhood Watch program, can have a reduction of reported crime of between 16 to 26 percent.

Whilst the signs only make up a small proportion of the crime prevention program, it does offer a visible acknowledgement that the program operates within our community.

As with any successful program, many pieces come together to make it a successful service. I encourage you to contact your Neighbourhood Watch Committee should you be aware of

a particular location that would benefit from the placement of a sign.

Crime reduction has a long lasting social and economic benefit. The success of the crime prevention program rests with the participation and engagement of the community it serves.
