In late April we held a well-attended forum at the Kauri Community and Sports Centre to hear from four of the federal election candidates for the seat of Boothby:

Nicolle Flint, Liberal; Nicole Hussey, Trumpet of Patriots; Louise Miller-Frost, Labor; Joanna Wells, Greens



We anticipated that Boothby would be a closely fought election and would play a role in deciding which party formed the Commonwealth Government for the next three years. Little did we know that there would be a solid swing nationwide and locally towards the Labor Party. We congratulate Louise Miller-Frost who was returned as the federal member for Boothby, and we send our commiserations to the other candidates, especially to Nicolle Flint who campaigned very hard on behalf of the Liberal Party and has previously represented us.

We are pleased that there has been an election commitment from the Labor Party (and the

Liberal Party) to invest \$150 million into a new healthcare centre at Flinders University/Hospital. Matched with funding from Flinders University, this will enable the construction of a new \$300 million "Flinders HealthCARE Centre". Hopefully construction will commence in 2027.

We are also looking forward to the imminent opening of the newly rebuilt Marino Community Hall, which was jointly funded by the Marion Council and the federal government. The new building at 44 Newland Road Marino is looking great and there is to be a grand opening event Sat 28th June.

The long dry spell has put native vegetation in the park under considerable stress, particularly last year's plantings. We had to resort to paying for a water truck to come and do some supplementary watering. The volunteers have been working hard already this year, watering, tackling olives, collecting seed to propagate for this year's planting and doing some general tidying up around the park.

Some good news though: we were successful with our latest Grant application for \$14,356, which will be used to clear a strip surrounding the landfill area. This will then be planted with native vegetation, creating a buffer zone around the landfill, which is currently being prepared for direct seeding of native grasses. This whole area will eventually be transformed from an unsightly patch of weeds into a field of native grasses, providing a food source for many native butterflies.



Since the autumn newsletter, there have been several developments on local dust issues. Thanks to all residents who supported action by contacting the relevant authorities.

On 5 March 2025, the daily allowable dust limit was again exceeded. Dust from Seacliff Village siteworks is also affecting nearby residents, particularly those near Kauri Sports Centre.

Member for Black Alex Dighton met us and visited the quarry site in April. He is arranging a meeting for our committee with Minister for Energy and Mines Tom Koutsantonis. A petition for presentation to the State Parliament and a community health survey are being circulated.

We appreciate Nicolle Flint's support and publicity of the issue during the Federal Election. We continue to communicate with Louise Miller-Frost, re-elected Boothby member.

We're advocating for Federal and State legislation changes to reduce and enforce quarry dust output limits near homes—crucial for long-term public health.

Winter is the best season to plant native species - cooler temperatures and regular rainfall help establish strong roots. Local natives provide food and shelter for wildlife and add resilience to our gardens and streetscapes.

Consider creating a native patch on your nature strip or blending native grasses and groundcovers into your existing garden. Layering with ground covers, shrubs and taller trees is a great way to support birds, bees and butterflies. The plantings around Seacliff train station look fantastic - thanks to the Rail Care Volunteers! Let's keep the momentum going at home.

Visit the *Holdfast Bay Verges* website for a list of native plants suitable for nature strips. Then head up to *State Flora* in Belair National Park to stock up.

A meeting has been scheduled with Alex Dighton MP to discuss this important matter, along with opportunities for broader safety and amenity improvements. As nearby stations receive welcome upgrades like new shelters, signage, and compliant paving, we're hopeful Marino Rocks will soon see similar enhancements that benefit the whole community.





Marino Railway Station Darren Bailhache, Campaign Organiser


Exciting news - upgrades to Marino Railway Station have officially begun! The project includes the installation of tactile paving for improved accessibility and a new curved shelter with seating, lean rails, and weather screens to enhance comfort for all passengers.

We're also pleased to share that the security camera system will be expanded to include the Newland Avenue car park, boosting safety across the station precinct. Work is expected to be completed by mid-2025, with remaining activity scheduled between 7am and 5pm, including the installation of cameras and a digital information kiosk.

With the station set for a significant transformation, now is the perfect time to join the Rail Care SA volunteer program. Led by Public Transport South Australia, this initiative supports station gardening and maintenance while building community connections.

Recently, an astute resident received a letter saying the rotunda shelter on Newland Ave Linear Park, Marino was shortly to be removed. She asked me why, as it still seemed in reasonable condition. Good question!

While the structure is getting old and the concrete underneath is compromised, it's still usable so I acted quickly to ensure the rotunda is kept for now. However, soon a decision must be made whether to replace it with a new shelter - so please let me know if you use the existing rotunda.

Meanwhile, in the 25/26 financial year, the area a little further north is due to receive an uplift, with a streetscaping project alongside the new Marino Community Hall, perhaps with street trees, rain gardens, textured pavement and improved pedestrian connections. Further detailed designs will be looked at shortly, so watch this space and I'd love your feedback.

Marino Repair Cafe Chris Teale

We belong to the Australian Repair Network which is part of a worldwide movement advocating for the Right to Repair and keeping independent shops open. When manufacturers don't make parts and tools available, they create repair monopolies that hurt small businesses. 96% of independent repair shops surveyed have to turn customers away because of repair restrictions. If the Right to Repair is not protected in law, these businesses will suffer. Manufacturers at their own service centers can push you to buy new instead of repairing and then shred reusable devices instead of recycling them. Having to compete with independent shops keeps manufacturers honest.

At our last event in May we repaired a variety of items including a Hifi system, amplifier, wall

heater, toasting press and a printer. In total we saved 35kg of stuff going to landfill. The Seacliff Uniting Church has been very supportive of our time in their space. We await a date to return to Marino Community Hall. Details will be posted on Facebook.



Federal Member for Boothby Louise Miller-Frost MP

Thank you to everyone in the Boothby community for trusting me to be your Federal Member. I am truly honoured and humbled- it's the honour of my life.

To everyone I've met at doors, polling booths, train stations, shopping centres, schools and community events, and to those who came to the 5049 Meet the Candidate event - thank you. Whether you voted for me or not, I will work every day to represent and support you.

In the 5049 coastal community, we're delivering real results. We secured \$500,000 in Federal funding for Seacliff Surf Life Saving Club to support vital upgrades.

Working with the State Government, we've locked in funding to install traffic lights at the Ocean Boulevard / Scholefield Road intersection. Together with the on/off ramps currently being built at Majors Road to ease pressure on Brighton Road, this will deliver a much safer Ocean Boulevard and Brighton Road. We secured \$2 million in State funding to upgrade Marino Railway Station - including a new shelter, digital display, and security improvements.

In 2022 we also committed \$3 million in Federal funding to the Marino Community Hall upgrade, partnering with the State Government and City of Marion to deliver this long-awaited project - and it's almost complete!

Beyond the 5049 coastline, we've made significant progress across Boothby and the nation - strengthening Medicare, expanding bulk billing, cutting HECS debt by 20%, delivering free TAFE and making our largest investment in housing in decades. Every worker received a tax cut - with more to come - plus energy bill relief and cheaper medicines. And through our Future Made in Australia plan, we're creating secure, well-paid jobs here at home.

Let's keep building Boothby's - and Australia's - future, together.
